

'Works have progressed well internally with the continuation of M&E second fix, plastering of the walls, and initial decorations. All utility connections have been made and are awaiting meter installation to allow final commissioning to commence shortly.



The external envelope is now weather tight with the completion of the roof, external windows and doors and the external walls. External wall cladding, and brickwork have continued and are well advanced. External works to form footpaths and playgrounds have started and are progressing well.

Whilst the works are still on track to be complete by the 20 December, there is a programme risk associated with the installation of the final drainage connection in accordance with the local water authority's connection policy which has recently been amended. A plan has been put in place to mitigate this risk.

Given that the works are on track, the new school will be ready to be occupied from 20 December, at which point the existing school can be decanted into the new school to suit the schools preferred timetable.'

The academy works closely with the Education Welfare Officer to support families who have low attendance figures. When a child's attendance drops below 90% it is identified as 'persistence absence' and the EWO will contact the family to offer support. Please ensure that your child is in school on time. Arrivals after 8.50am are marked as late in the register. Please contact the academy office if any support is required – we are here to help.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court. Please see our website for more information on our attendance policy:
